



'No,' said the Chimpanzee, 'and I never said he was. The Hyæna said it.' 'Then the Hyæna ought to be ashamed of himself,' said the White Bear in a judicial tone. 'Does the Giraffe teach history?' 'No,' said the Chimpanzee; 'but he eats dates.' And more of the same sort. The dialogue throughout is delightfully amusing."
