INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the Obituary Record was described in full in the introduction to the first number, published June, 1897, and it is not necessary to repeat it here.

The four numbers of the Record contain sketches of 249 deceased alumni, 127 of Marshall College and 122 of Franklin and Marshall, and statistics referring to the whole number are herewith given. Of the 188 graduates of Marshall College all have died except 61. The classes of 1837 and 1841 have no surviving member.
